River Night

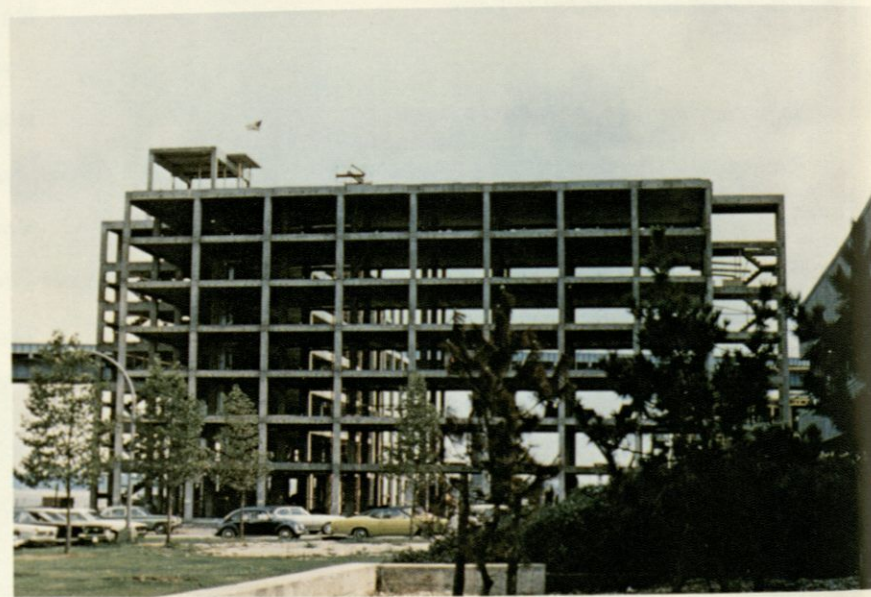
*The moon shines like sequines upon the water,

Settled down for the night.*

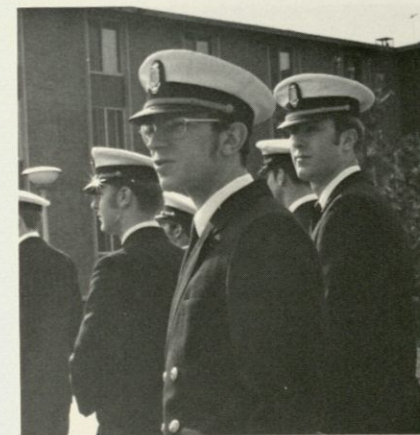
